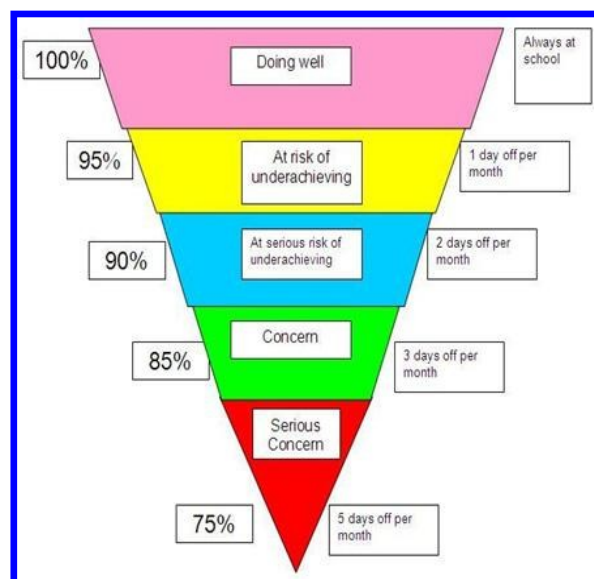

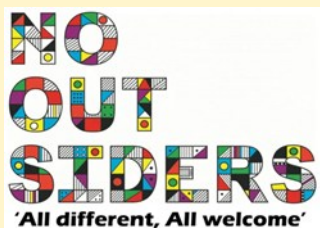

No Outsiders



Each week, in our 'No Outsiders' assembly, we ask the children 'What do you see in this picture? What do you notice? What might this story be about?'

Murphy the Eagle



This week in our No Outsiders assembly, we met Murphy, a 31-year-old bald eagle living at a bird sanctuary in the USA. Murphy surprised his keepers by carefully building a nest around a rock and protecting it as though it were an egg. When an orphaned eagle chick later arrived at the sanctuary, the keepers made the brave decision to see if Murphy could become its parent.

Although Murphy had never raised a chick before, he gently cared for it, protected it and even fed it when it was too young to feed itself. His actions showed that being a family is not about looking a certain way or fitting a particular role – it is about showing love, care, patience and helping one another to grow.

We discussed whether Murphy should have been given the opportunity and reflected on the many different types of families in our own communities. We recognised that families can all look different, but what matters most is that they are caring, supportive and full of love.

This linked beautifully to our No Outsiders work and the British Value of Mutual Respect and Tolerance, reminding us that everyone deserves to belong and that kindness can be found in many different forms.

We encourage you to discuss further with your child. Some ideas for discussion points could be:

Why do you think the keepers trusted Murphy to care for the chick?

Families can all look different. What do you think is the most important thing that all families have in common?

Have you ever been given the chance to try something new because someone believed in you? How did it make you feel?
