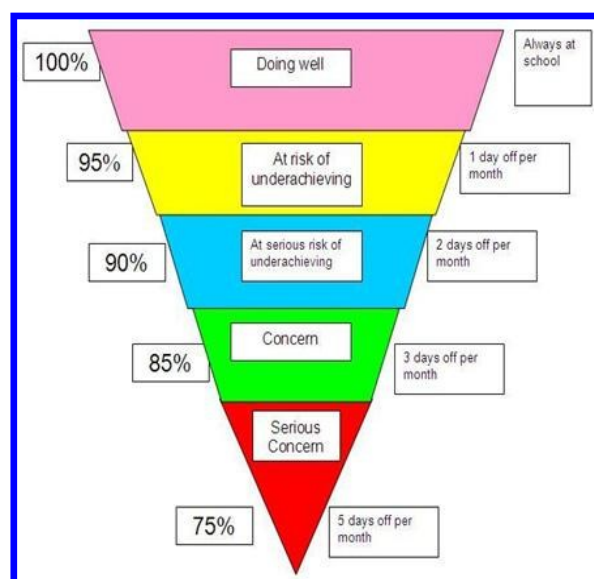

Football Tournament

Y4 Dentist Workshop

Period Dignity

The Vale of Glamorgan has been playing a key role in delivering the Welsh Government's Period Dignity initiative ensuring all learners in the county have access to free period products. At its core, the initiative seeks to challenge the stigmas and taboos around periods. By encouraging more conversations, pupils will better understand periods, what is normal, feel increasingly comfortable and know where to seek help.

This scheme has since been widened to include all members of the public and there are currently 60+ Period Dignity Collection points within the Vale of Glamorgan (these can be viewed on the Vale of Glamorgan's Period Dignity web page). This includes the use of Period Dignity Dispensers which have been trialled at a number of venues and have proved very popular. These dispensers are filled on a regular basis with sanitary products - pads, tampons, menstrual cups etc and are free for any members of the public who wish to access them.

Victoria Primary School recognise the importance of the Period Dignity initiative and after the success of the Period Dignity workshops last year, we have elected to become a Period Dignity Collection point to support the whole community. Our Dispenser will be placed in the corner of the foyer within the school. Please feel free to access this provision whenever you need to. Period products such as single-use panty liners and sanitary pads will be fully accessible. However, if you wish to access reusable pads, period pants, tampons or menstrual cups, please do not hesitate to get in contact with our office staff who will be able to help you.

Please note: we will not be providing tampons or menstrual cups to our children at Victoria Primary School due to the younger age and maturity of our children but they will be freely available for anyone older in the community (siblings, parents, etc).
