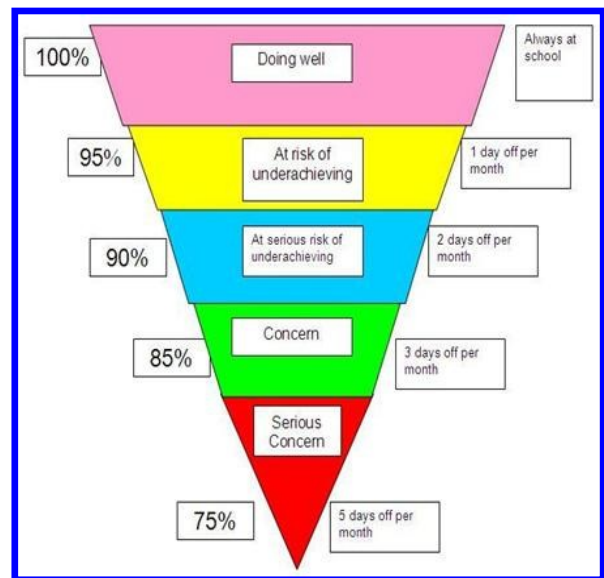

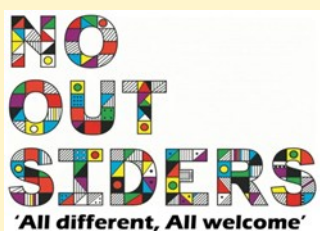

No Outsiders



Each week , in our 'No Outsiders ' assembly, we ask the children 'What do you see in this picture? What do you notice? What might this story be about?



This week in our Key stage 2 No Outsiders Assembly, with many of us watching the 2026 World Cup, we looked at one of the England players: Dan Burn, who plays for Newcastle, and how the club are making the matches more accessible for people who are hearing impaired.

The RNID lettering on Dan Burns shirt represents the National hearing loss charity that Newcastle United football club supports.

We reminded ourselves of the language in our school vision, in particular the importance of creating an inclusive environment in school for all our learners.

The children reflected on an important message: our differences should be celebrated, and everyone deserves to feel that they belong.

We encourage you to discuss further with your child. Some ideas for discussion points could be:

What does an 'inclusive society' mean, and why is it important?

How can we include others when we are playing with our friends?
