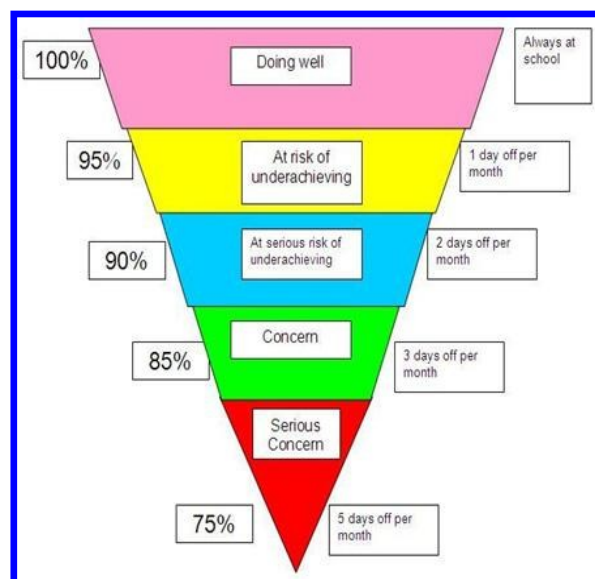
I am sure that if I am ever unavailable to attend school, the children will ensure everything runs smoothly. Well done to them all.

After lunch, we completed the questionnaire and collected the names of the stars of the week and Welsh speakers. Finally we wrote a piece for the newsletter.

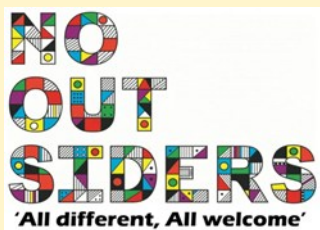

## No Outsiders



Each week, in our 'No Outsiders' assembly, we ask the children 'What do you see in this picture? What do you notice? What might this story be about?'

### Sport for Everyone 🌍❤️



This week, our No Outsiders assemblies explored how sport can bring people together and how everyone deserves the opportunity to take part, belong and succeed.

In Foundation Phase, we discussed a photograph of two friends enjoying a football match together. One of the friends was blind and relied on his companion to describe the action on the pitch. The children thought carefully about friendship, support and the different ways people can experience the same event. They explored how small acts of kindness and understanding can help everyone feel included.

In Key Stage 2, pupils learned about England footballer Djed Spence, who has become the first Muslim player to represent the senior England men's team at a World Cup. We explored how football clubs are becoming more inclusive by recognising and supporting people's different needs, backgrounds and beliefs. The children discussed how making simple adjustments, such as providing spaces for prayer or understanding religious practices, helps ensure everyone feels welcome.

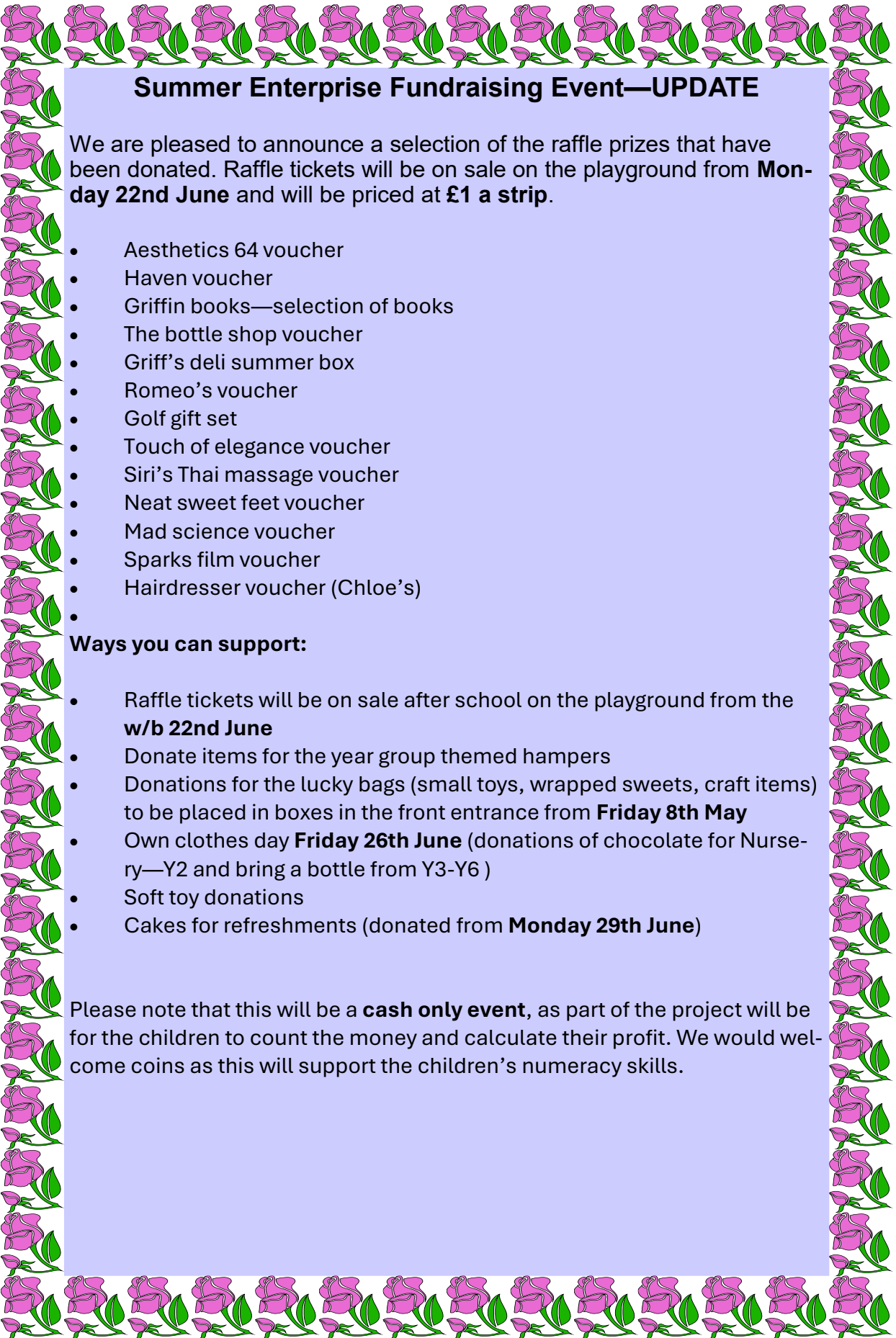
Although the stories were different, both assemblies shared the same important message: sport is at its best when everyone can take part. Whether supporting a friend, adapting activities, understanding someone's faith or recognising different needs, inclusion helps people feel that they belong.

**We encourage you to discuss further with your child. Some ideas for discussion points could be:**

What makes you feel welcome and included when you join a club, team or activity?  
How can coaches, leaders or teachers help everyone feel able to take part and succeed?

What can we learn from people who have different experiences, cultures, beliefs or abilities from our own?

Which is better: changing the person so they fit the activity, or changing the activity so everyone can join in?
