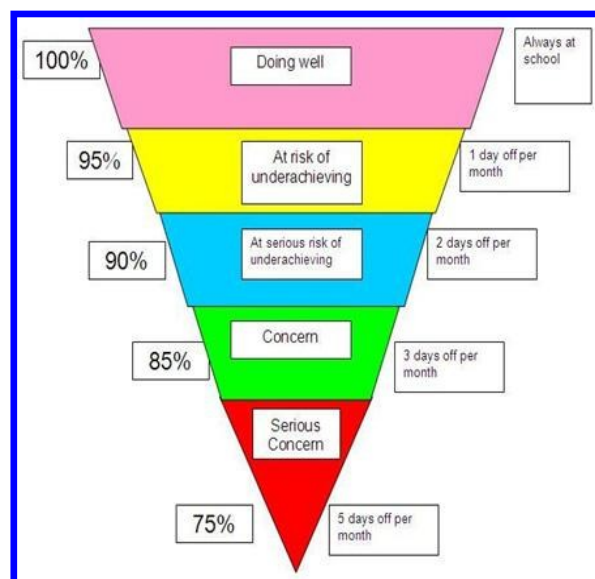

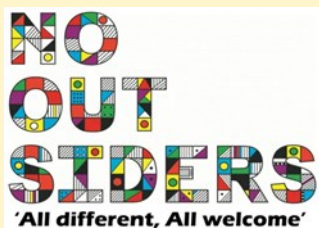

No Outsiders



Each week, in our 'No Outsiders' assembly, we ask the children 'What do you see in this picture? What do you notice? What might this story be about?'

One Team, Many Stories



This week in our Outsiders Assembly, with the 2026 World Cup underway and England and Scotland representing the UK, we used the England squad to explore diversity, belonging and the No Outsiders message that everyone is welcome.

The children noticed that the team is made up of players from a wide range of backgrounds and family histories. We learned that many players have connections to different countries, cultures and communities, reflecting the rich diversity of modern Britain.

We explored how our backgrounds, experiences and family stories help make us who we are, but they do not stop us belonging. Just as the England team is united by a shared goal, people from different backgrounds can come together to build strong communities.

This linked perfectly to our No Outsiders work and the British Value of Mutual Respect and Tolerance. The children reflected on an important message: our differences should be celebrated, and everyone deserves to feel that they belong.

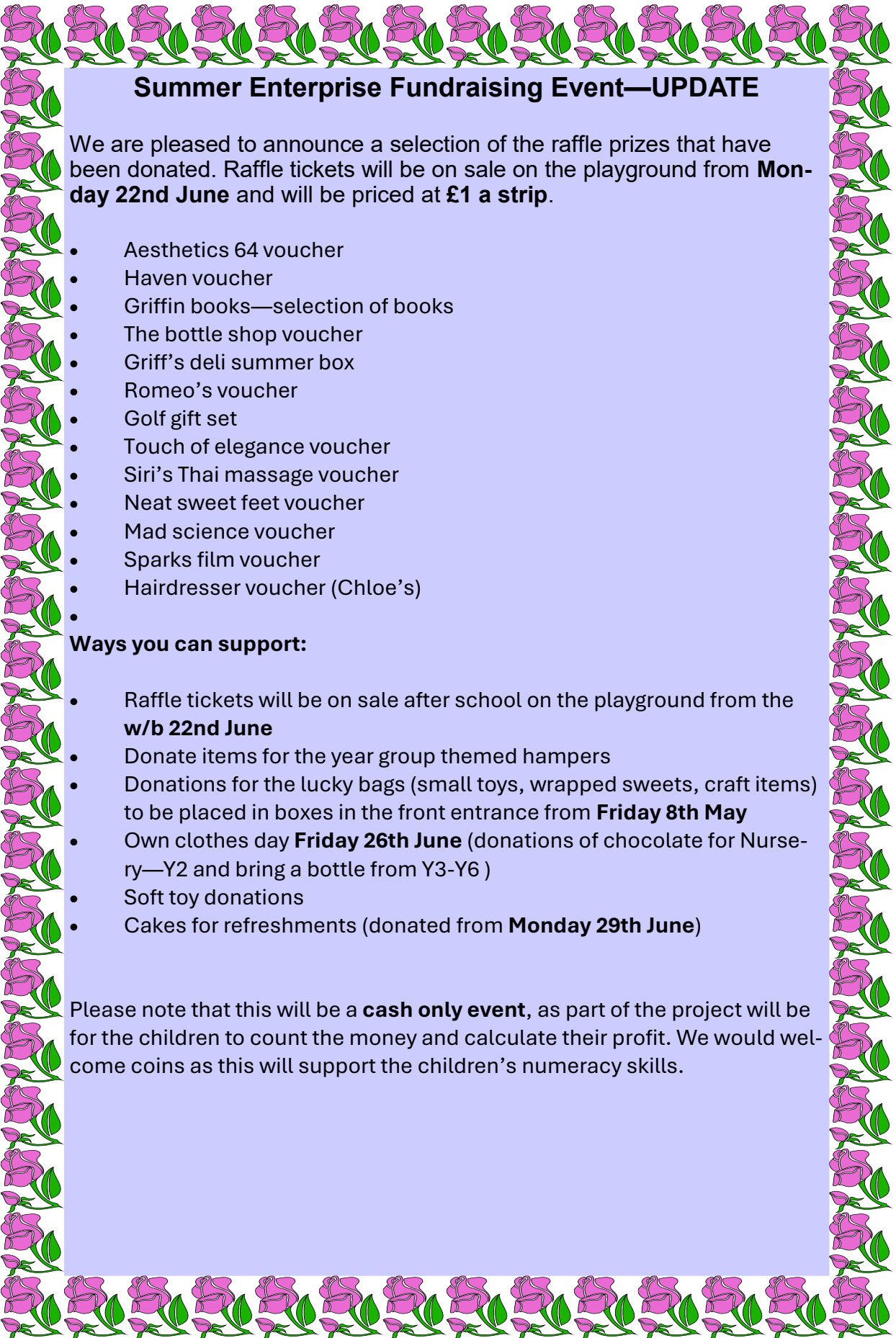
We encourage you to discuss further with your child. Some ideas for discussion points could be:
